# EXPORT POTENTIAL IN RAJASTHAN: STRENGTH OF RAJASTHAN IN TERMS OF INDUSTRIAL EXPORT

#### **ABSTRACT**

Since independence, exports have been given high priority and country has worked to achieve growth in export. India entered into the era of trade reforms in 1991 and is moving gradually towards an open economy. The significance of export from country not only in earning foreign exchange but also provides consistent growth with some indirect benefits such as sustainable and inclusive growth for developing countries. India has diversified framework, different regions, different priority sectors and their requirements are different. Rajasthan, the largest state in geographical area terms, contributed about 2.38 % to India's export basket. The State is abundantly rich in natural resources, has ready availability of labour pool and is also historically endowed with wealth. Clearly, the export potential of this state is yet to be fully realized.

#### Introduction

Export holds the key not only for healthy and balance of payment position and macro-economic, but also for planned and sustained development. In the absence of a strong performance on the export front, the balance of payment position of country comes under strain and retards economic progress. India's export basket was worth Rs. 18.87% of GDP in the year 2017-2018 and the States of Gujarat, Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu and Karnataka contributed to bulk of the exports. The top two states of Gujarat and Maharashtra contributed close to 50% of the total exports. Rajasthan economy is the 8th biggest economy in India with the net State Domestic Product (NSDP) of more than US\$ 11.5 billion. The landlocked nature of the State has significantly restricted its access to a wider market as compared to the better performing states like Gujarat, Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu, all of which have a long coastline. Barring this obvious disadvantage, Rajasthan shares its borders with 6 states and acts as a direct connect between the manufacturing hubs in northern part of the country and the major ports in western part of the country. With its proximity to both these regions, the State is a promising investment destination, and both the State and Central Government are actively promoting improvement in output and exports from the State.

Rajasthan has traditionally been an exporter of primary goods and value added items. Rajasthan has traditionally been strong in exports of handicrafts, gems and jewellery, dimensional stones, agro products, and textile products. The top five export items from Rajasthan accounting for nearly two-thirds of exports from the State are textiles (including readymade garments), gems and jewellery, engineering goods, chemical and allied products (including tyres), and handicrafts. Agro and food products, dimensional stones comprising marble, granites and articles of stone mica, metals (ferrous and non-ferrous), and electronics and computer software are also important sectors having a share of more than 5% each in Rajasthan's exports. In the present scenario in terms of services exports, tourism and hospitality is a key segment in Rajasthan and has immense potential for earning foreign exchange revenue for the State. In fact, Rajasthan has been steadily gaining prominence in the global markets as an important tourist destination of India. In 2017, about 10.18 million foreign tourists arrived in India and Rajasthan was host to about 6% of this number.

#### **Exports Scenario**

Today we are witnessing exponential growth in all spheres of all industrial activity in the State and the export segment is no different. In Rajasthan it is truly remarkable to observe level of growth in export in wide range of sector such Textile and apparel, Gems and Jewellery, Engineering, Agro and Food processing, Metals, Carpets, Handicrafts, Dimensional stone. Over the year we have seen many new categories coming up with strong export potentialities like Engineering, Coir, wool, Dairy and Horticulture. Rajasthan total export about 46 thousand crores INRS.

A comparative study of export figures of Rajasthan and the Country as a whole reveals that Rajasthan's contribution towards export in 2017-18 was Rs. 46476.92 crores in all India figure of Rs. 1955541.12 crores, which is approximately 2.38%. Though, that is very small share of Country's total export , this has to be viewed that industrial development was virtually non- existence in the State. However, industrial development has a sea- change and the number of large scale industries has risen about 385 and the no. of MSME unit has gone upto 7.91 in year 2017-18. The increase in export from State has kept pace with the tempo of Industrial development in recent years. Thus, export from State has risen from Rs. 31.14 crores in 1973- 74 to Rs. 46476.92 crores in the year 2017-18. With the onset of economic reforms, the approach towards Export and Import is changing fast. The State government has also shifted its role from being a regulator to a "Facilitator to Promoter". The State Government made efforts for boosting exports from the State ranging from craftsmen to micro , small, medium and large scale entrepreneurs and industrialist.

## Strengths of Rajasthan in Terms of Export Potential

The State government determined to accelerate economic growth and create large scale employment in Rajasthan. State is a promising investment destination, and both the State and Central Government are actively promoting improvement in output and exports from the State for this purpose new measures including a dedicated Export Development and Promotion Policy, Scheme for export facilitation, market access and export linkages are under consideration. For further development, 'Ease of Doing Business' Export Infrastructure comprising of Research and Development Centres, certification and testing laboratories and improvement in logistic will enable us to catalyze growth and further realize our potential in sector. Rajasthan as a state offers some advantages for exports which are listed below:

### N Strategic Location

8380 sq. km. of Rajasthan falls in National Capital Region (NCR) which is around 24.50% of total National Capital Region, the world's second largest urban agglomeration. Industries in Rajasthan have to their advantage, access to this enormous market.

#### N Excellent Connectivity

Rajasthan has second largest railway network of National Highways in the country. With a total road length exceeding 7310 Km. National Highway provide excellent connectivity to cities like Delhi, Jabalpur, Bhopal, Ahmedabad, Vadodara, Mumbai, Amritsar, Gwalior, Agra, Indore. Rajasthan has airports at Jodhpur, Udaipur, and airstrips in other major districts. At Air - Cargo complex at Jaipur, and Inland Container Depots at Jaipur (2), Jodhpur (3) Bhilwara and Bhiwadi facilitate trade within and outside India.

**Delhi -Mumbai Industrial Corridor:** provides opportunities for industrial establishment along the route are eminent as the corridor will make Rajasthan easily accessible to western and northern markets. About 60% of State's area (22 Districts including major districts such as Jaipur, Alwar, Kota and Bhilwara) falls within the DMIC area. With this, the State will become an attractive destination for setting up industrial and support infrastructure units.

# N Land Availability

Rajasthan, geographically largest state of India, offers land in plenty and at comparative prices. Rajasthan Industrial Development and Investment Corporation Ltd. (RIICO) ensure top class infrastructure and other related support for establishment of new enterprises. To catalyze industrialization the corporation has developed 327 industrial areas close to 74,228 acres throughout the State. Furthermore, the State Government has made several provisions under the relevant laws for leasing of government land and simplifying the procedure for conversion of land for agri- business activities.

**Agro Food Parks:** RIICO has developed four Agro Food Parks in Kota, Jodhpur Sriganganagar and Alwar for development of agriculture based industries. Another food park is being developed near by Kishangarh in Ajmer district by M/s Greentech Mega Food Park Ltd., under the Scheme of Government of India.
