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ABSTRACT

Role of Emotional Intelligence in Alpha Generation

Today, technology has become an integral part of life and also it is easy to access world's information at just one click. People start their day with technological alarm, online order for food, online classes, online payment, online shopping and entertain themselves through technology (Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, Netflix). It indicates that people are depending almost on technological advancement because work of life become easier with the help of technology. Technology offers students a way to enhance reading skill, writing skill, knowledge and higher level of self-esteem. But students cannot be emotionally connected with the technology, it cannot understand their emotions, they never learn experience of practical life which means that internet and technology never supersede the role of teachers for their students, which is incredible. Teachers are not only taking the responsibility for completion of syllabus and prepare marksheet with flying colours but also develop the creativity, analytical skill and social skill of the students.

In India, the children are deviating from the right path due to stress and anxiety. One report revealed that 50% of school students are stressed out due to heavy academic syllabus, long study hrs., parental pressure, academic achievement and so on (The Times of India,2019). The shocking news is that more than 10% students of class 8-12 have used drugs for relaxing their mind (The Times of India,2019). They need a guide or a mentor who understands their problems and gives better solution to them. A good relation between teachers and students is needed and for a good relationship, teachers should be emotionally connected with the students. In the absence of an emotionally mature teachers, students are not comfortable to share their problems and for handling this situation they are indulging in various kinds of addiction like smack, charas, alcohol, bhang, whitener etc. Because students are not able to understand the right or wrong things. In lots of situation parents are not ready to talk in these sentimental issues but teachers can. And for this there is highly needed of emotionally intelligent teachers in schools.

Therefore, here is a requirement to study of hiring process of teachers in school and then find out the impact of emotional intelligence of teachers on hiring process because students need highly emotionally mature teachers in their life.

Review of Literature

Samanviha & Jawahar (2012) found that emotional intelligence of teachers has a strong and positive impact on job performance and satisfaction. And if any employee is satisfied with their job, then he or she can contribute their 100% effort. They also highlighted that a highly emotionally intelligent teacher can get more satisfaction with his or her performance.

Mandip et al. (2012) highlighted that in this stressful scenario one of the biggest challenges for any school and college, is to retain the intellectual and highly emotionally intelligent teachers in their organization and they are the real asset because they are able to handle their own emotions and they can guide, understand, motivate and control their students in a healthy manner. In this article it is also revealed that the relationship between emotional intelligence of teachers and job satisfaction is positive.

Robert & Precious (2017) investigated that in this day students are emotionally challenged with drug abuse, family issues, sexual greediness and etc. and for handling this situation module of emotional intelligence should be introduced in the education sector so that more positive result may be achieved. They also highlighted that this module has a positive influence on academic performance and productivity.

Akomolafe (2011) explained that emotional intelligence is a significant factor to reduce occupational stress among secondary school teachers. He also revealed that there is a need for development of that kinds of programs to enhance the emotional intelligence of teachers for controlling their stress.

It is found in this review process that in today's world everyone has professional as well as personal issues and stress and emotional intelligence capability can help them out.

Objectives

- To study the impact of emotional intelligence on the recruitment process of teachers in schools.
- To understand the perception of recruiters towards emotional intelligence of candidates (teachers).

Hypothesis

H_o: There is no difference among the perception of recruiters of different schools with respect to the impact of emotional intelligence of teachers.

Research Methodology

The research paper is based on primary data collected through questionnaire to know the extent of agreement and disagreement for validating the facts. The sample size is 42 and respondents are the recruiters (Principal, Directors and HR department) of CBSE schools in Patna. Further, a well-designed questionnaire using Likert scale is prepared. The responses are classified, and the results are presented through graphs and hypothesis have been tested using Kolmogorov-Smirnov(K-S) test.

- Total no of responses-40



- Total number of responses-40.



- Total number of responses-40



- Total no of respondents-40



- Total nu of respondents-40



