Global economic governance refers to the mechanisms and institutions that facilitate cooperation and coordination among countries in managing and regulating the global economy. International organizations play a crucial role in this process by providing platforms for dialogue, establishing rules and standards and promoting collaboration among nations. Several international organization contribute to global economic governance, each with its own specific mandate and focus. Some of the key organizations include.

- **World Bank**

The world bank, established in 1944, is an international financial institution that aims to reduce global poverty and support sustainable development. Comprising two main institutions THE INTERNATIONAL BANK FOR RECONSTRUCTION AND DEVELOPMENT (IBRD) and the INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT ASSOCIATION (IDA) the world bank provides financial and technical assistance to developing countries. The IBRD primarily extends loans to middle- income and creditworthy low- income countries for projects and programs that aim to improve infrastructure, education, healthcare and other key sectors. These loans are offered at low interest and have relatively long repayment periods.

- **World Trade Organization (WTO)**

The World Trade Organization (WTO) is an international organization that regulates and facilitates global trade. Established in 1995, the WTO serves as a platform for member countries to negotiate trade agreements, resolve disputes and sea international trade rules. With 164 member, the WTO plays a crucial role in fostering a predictable and transparent trading environment. One of the primary functions of the WTO is to provide a forum for trade negotiations. Member countries engage in multilateral negotiations to establish rules and agreements that govern various aspects of international trade, such as tariffs, subsidies and intellectual property rights. The most significant agreement under the WTO is the General agreement On Tariffs And Trade (GATT), which has undergone multiple rounds of negotiations aimed at liberalizing global trade.

- **The role of UN Specialized Bodies**

As this study Indicates, the UN possesses specialized technical bodies that play a crucial role in the negotiation and adoption of legally instruments, such as treaties, conventions, agreements and directives. The majority of international treaties and conventions established by the UN incorporate monitoring mechanisms to ensure the implementation of the respective legal instruments. These mechanisms often include reporting requirements for the parties involved and generate conclusions and recommendations from the monitoring bodies for example, within the framework of the Universal periodic Review (UPR) , the UN Human Rights Council (HRC), an intergovernmental organization established by the UN General Assembly (UNGA) through resolution on March 15,2006 examines the human rights records of all 193 UN member states. These processes possess investigative or quasi judicial

characteristics, such as the HRC's special procedures for addressing human rights situations or violations, as well as the communications procedures of UN human rights treaty bodies.

- **Common Roles played by International Organization In Global Governance**

Establishment and perpetuation of norms: The norms are perpetuated through agreement and policies adopted in UN chapter. For example, which prohibits the use of force against the territorial of another state. "All members shall refrain in their international relations from the threat or use of force against the territorial integrity or political independence of any state, or in any other manner inconsistent with the purposes of the United Nations". It is for this reason that UN security council condemned Russia invasion of Ukraine on March 22nd, 2022. Development of plans and policies to implement the adopted norms.

- **The Function of The United nations In Global Governance**

The purpose of the UN according to maintain international peace and security and to that end to take effective collective measures for the prevention and removal of threats to the peace, to develop friendly relations among nation based on respect for the principle of equal right and self determination of people, to achieve international cooperation in solving international problems of an economic, social, cultural or humanitarian character and to be a center for harmonizing the action of nations in the attainment of these common ends". This shows the interdependence of the UN with states. "Through centralized coordination and cooperation, the UN created mechanisms that established mutual accountability between states, governed by growing and increasingly entrenched principles of international law".

Challenges Faced by International Organization

- **Sovereignty and compliance**

One of the primary challenges for international organizations (IOs) is balancing the sovereignty of member states with the necessity for compliance with international policies. This tension arises because states are often reluctant to cede control over their domestic affairs to supranational entities, especially when such policies conflict with their national interests or political agendas. International organizations, such as the United Nations (UN) and the World Trade Organization (WTO) operate based on the principle of state sovereignty, which grants countries the authority to govern their own territories and make decisions independently. However, for these organizations to function effectively and achieve their goals, member states infringe upon national sovereignty. For instance, the WTO requires its members to comply with trade agreements that may necessitate changes in domestic laws and regulations, potentially limiting a state's ability to implement protectionist measures that serve its economic or political interests.

- **Funding and Resource Constraints**

International organizations frequently grapple with funding shortages and resource constraints that undermine their effectiveness in implementing and monitoring policies. These financial limitations can severely impact their capacity to address global issues, enforce compliance and provide essential services to member states. One notable example is the World Health Organization (WTO) which has historically faced funding challenges that hinder its ability to respond to global health emergencies comprehensively. The WHO's financial structure relies heavily on voluntary contributions from member states and other donors, which can be unpredictable and often come with earmarks for specific projects, limiting the organization's flexibility in resource allocation. This reliance on voluntary funding, as opposed to assessed contributions, which are mandatory and more stable, means that the WTO often operates under a constrained budget, affecting its operational capabilities.
