Today's current education system lacks the spiritual aspect of the search for truth. We are providing only scientific attitude to the students, but until a spiritual attitude does not develop in them, they will not be able to become virtuous. Spiritual development is more important than scientific development. Therefore, this thought of Abdul Kalam is relevant even today.
